RISM, JPPH, PEPS and BVAM, as the principal members of AVA Malaysia, will be assisting in organising the event.

Report on the Ghana Institution Of Surveyors (Ghis) 18™ Surveyors' Week & 54[™] Annual General Meeting Submitted to CASLE

The Ghana Institution of Surveyors (GhIS) held its 18th Surveyors' Week and 54th Annual General Meeting from 18 - 26 February, 2023, at the Cedi Center, University of Ghana in Accra. The conference was attended by more than 700 of its members, practicing around the country.

It kicked off with family day and sporting event on Saturday, 18 February and a Press Conference and formal Launching of the 18th Surveyors Week and 54th AGM on Monday, 20 February.

The Young Surveyors Network (YSN) held its AGM and Elections on Tuesday, 21 February for reorganisation of the Network to foster growth. The Surv. Rev. Rosemargaret Esubonteng, FGhIS (IPP) chaired the programme and introduced the young surveyors to the GhIS Career and Mentorship Program and online portal.

The conference started in earnest on Wednesday, 22 February focusing on the theme "*Transforming Land Administration in Ghana – The role of the Surveying Professional*". The keynote and other speakers covered speeches and technical sessions covered a range of topics in land administration in Ghana.

The keynote address during the Official opening was delivered by Senyo Kwasi Hosi, Founder and Executive Chairman of Kleeve and Tove Ltd. His exposition on the theme was riveting and provocative.

In addition to the technical sessions, the conference also featured the elevation of 16 members to the class of Fellow and induction of 187 newly qualified members with one Technician member. The Governing Council awarded best performing members in the professional training as well as students in the national universities.
